- General Knowledge (including current affairs)
- Code of Civil Procedure, 1908
- Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973

- law of contract, 1872
- Indian Penal Code, 1860

Jharkhand judiciary Main/Written Exam Syllabus 2023:
